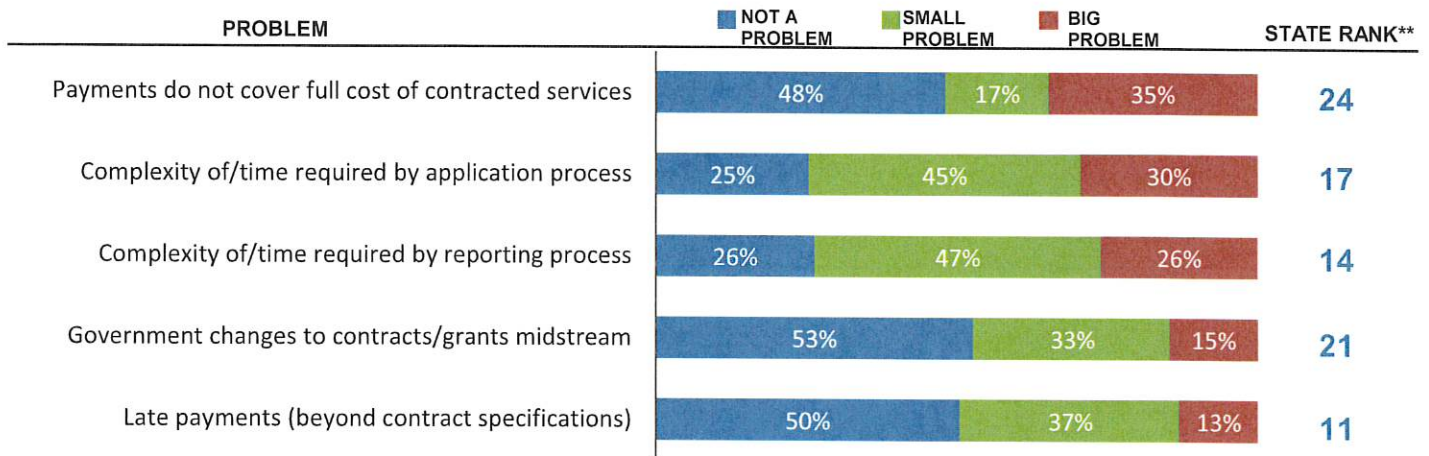

59%

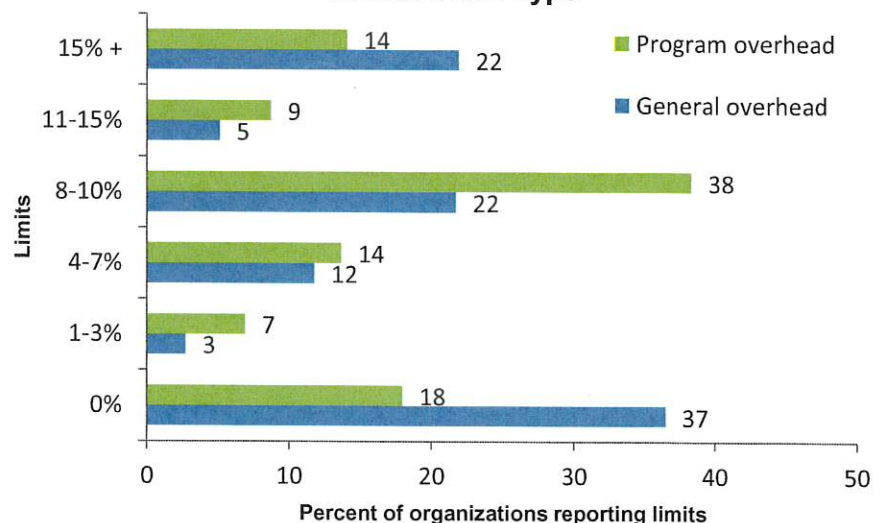
Contracts require matching or sharing costs

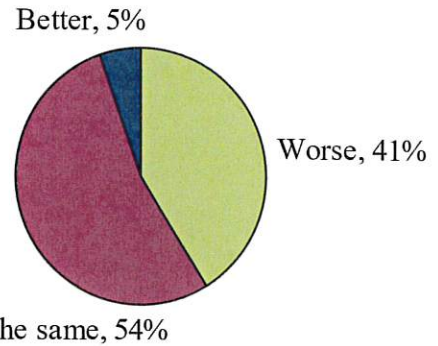

Number of Government Contracts/Grants per Nonprofit

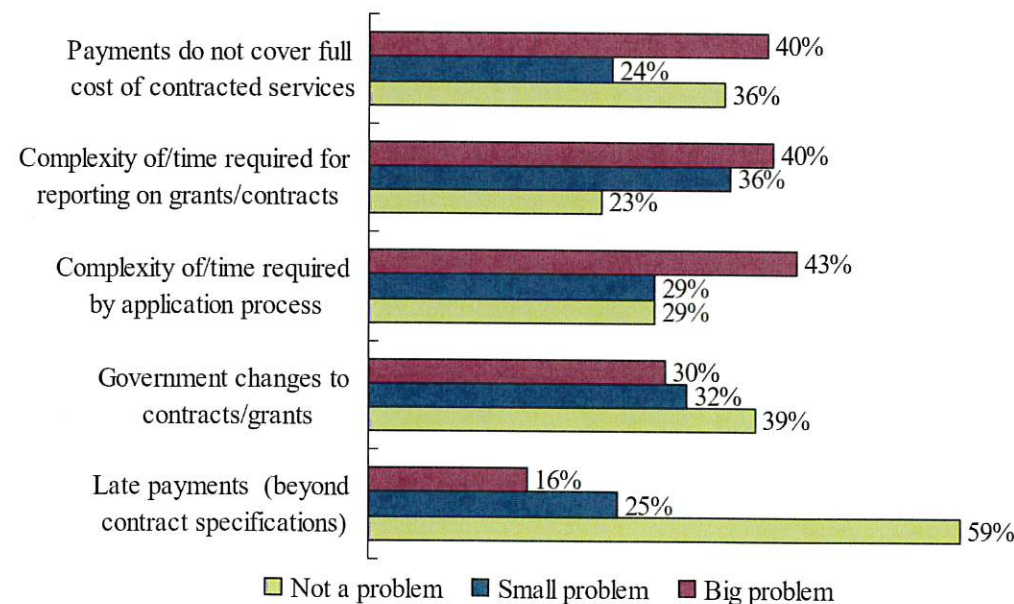
1 government contract/grant	23%
